### VERACRUZ RAPTOR MIRGRATION & BIRDING ADVENTURE

## $5^{th} - 14^{th}$ OCTOBER, 2024

This exciting ten-day, nine-night trip promises to be a formidable experience due to the importance of the sites to be visited. Get to know the wonders of the Veracruz River of Raptors, a project promoted by Pronatura Veracruz A.C., which supports the conservation of birds of prey and their roosting sites along the most important migratory corridor in the world, with the help of experts in raptor migration.

During more than 35 years of monitoring, the Veracruz River of Raptors project has recorded 22 species of migratory raptors, not counting the huge groups of waterbirds and passerines. We also visit some sites of interest in Puerto de Veracruz and Xalapa where we find very diverse habitat and a large diversity of birds.

Veracruz has 528 species of birds in the whole state, and we have time to take in the beautiful landscapes and the impressive gastronomy of this amazing destination while enjoying this first class birding destination.

# **Tour highlights:**

Alot of effort has been taken in this tour to include unique destinations and opportunities, not found in other tours, and a strong emphasis on supporting local biologists, guides and organizations promoting an 'everybody' wins vision, where we start to address the question of how do we leave a place in better shape than we found it?

Birdlife and habitats in Mexico have huge pressure from local human activity, and traditional resort tourism. It is our thought that with carefully designed tourism, we can leave a very positive impact? This tour is our starting point in creating and finding a better way forward. # **Details on TOP SIGHTS visited:**

## Veracruz Reef Landscape

The historic city of Veracruz is the gateway to Mexico from the east, the place where the modern history not only of a nation, but of an entire continent began to be written. This modern and populous city is rich in biodiversity, close by we find wonderful mangrove swamps, coastal lagoons and estuaries that provide habitat for a great amount of wildlife & birdlife.



Among the sites to visit are the mangrove swamp of Arroyo Moreno, Mata de Uva beach and Cabezo Island, where we can observe birds, such as Laughing Falcon, Morelet's Seedeater and Masked Booby.

## **Chichicaxtle Bird Observatory**



The Dr. Mario Ramos Bird Observatory will be one of the main stops on this trip. From the first floor of the tower, you will be able to observe the most abundant raptor migration in the world. In addition, in the vicinity of the observatory, several species of interest such as Blue-grey Tanager, Bat Falcon and Buff-bellied Hummingbird can be observed. This space also has a bird-focused gift shop and is the venue for the environmental education workshops held in the community each year, as part of the

educational program of the Veracruz River of Raptors project.

#### La Mancha

This impressive site for shorebirds and waterfowl will be one of the must-see stops for this expedition, thanks to its large and wide beach, as well as its connection to the Laguna La Mancha. This point alone has around 300 species, among which we could observe Muscovy Duck, Long-billed Curlew, Sandwich Tern, Olive-throated Parakeet, Blue-gray Tanager and others.



## Parque Ecoturístico Mirarmar Viveros



The Miramar Ecotourism Park is one of the monitoring stations of the Veracruz River of Raptors project since 2021. This site has a breathtaking view of the Sierra Madre Oriental and the imposing Gulf of Mexico.

The strategic location of this site allows us to appreciate the migration at a very short distance, being able to observe some individuals even at eye level. The journey to the site allows many species of birds to be seen in the vegetation like Moctezuma Oropendola, Scissor-tailed Flycatcher and Yellow-headed Parrot.



## Xocotitla

We will visit the private conservation area Xocotitla in search of the Mexican Sheartail, Tropical Mockingbird and Aplomado Falcon.

This site was formally constituted in 2016 but has more than 40 years of experience in the management and conservation of wild flora and fauna. It has some 206 bird species and is a resting place for migratory raptors in spring and fall.



## Villa Rica

A picturesque Mexican town located on the coast of Veracruz. Here we can observe coastal and aquatic birds. In addition, the ravine located near the coast will allow us to watch Altamira oriol, Amazon Kingfisher, Couch's Kingbird and others.

## Quiahuixtlán

The Archaeological Zone of Quiahuiztlán is a Totonaca settlement located very close to where Hernán Cortés founded the Villa de Rica de la Veracruz, the first Spanish town hall in Mexico, and where an alliance between the Totonaca peoples and the Spaniards was later made to conquer the Tenochca empire.

Besides the cultural richness of this place, the view it offers of the Gulf of Mexico identifies it as one of the ideal sites to observe the largest raptor migration in the world. This site gives you the opportunity to observe the birdlife the moment you wake up in the morning after getting a good night sleep.





## Xalapa

A picturesque city, now the capital of the state of Veracruz, founded in 1519 by Totonaca indigenous families and converted into a colonial town after the conquest. It is located in the area known as the great mountains, so the climate and the species of birds present are very different from those found on the coast. It is also a city with many bodies of water, beautiful gardens, parks and natural reserves of great environmental and social importance.



Among the sites to visit are the Museum of Anthropology, the MacuitepetI Ecological Park, the 'El Haya' Park, and the Francisco Javier Clavijero Botanical Garden. Some of the bird species possible to observe are: Mangrove Cuckoo, Graylag Groose, Azure-hooded Jay, and Longbilled Thrasher.

# Museo del Café

To end our tour in the best way possible, we will visit a coffee farm on the outskirts of the city of Xalapa. We will be able to walk around the site while bird watching and at the end we will have a delicious lunch and coffee tasting.

Café-tal Apan is a company that was founded in 2003 and is interested in the welfare of the people. Its philosophy has been to promote small-scale production, marketing and coffee culture in Mexico, paying fair prices for excellent beans and supporting producers who are responsible for the conservation of ecosystems.

President and founder of Birds and Nature A.C., a non-governmental organization focused on promoting the knowledge and conservation of nature through bird watching, environmental education and citizen science. She is also a member of CONABIO's Urban Birds Program and Amazilias network.

Marine biologist and bilingual nature tourism guide. She has collaborated as a counting assistant, accountant and banding station volunteer in the Veracruz Rio de Rapaces project for 8 seasons since 2010. Internationally she has been part of the scientific banding teams at New Mexico National Parks and CBR Costa Rica Bird Observatory.




